Words of Institution

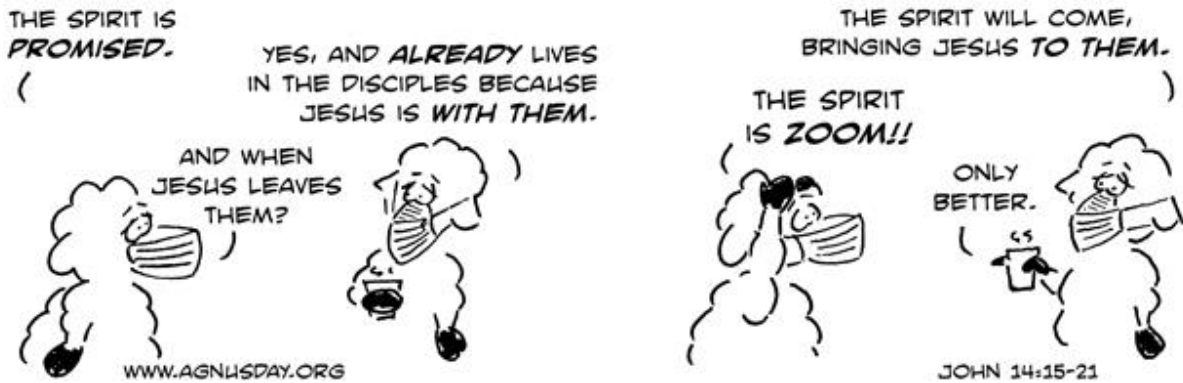
