As I try to be the non-anxious presence among you, I listen, ponder, and pray for your strength for all the challenges that I hear so many people face in today's world. The uncertainty of human life, the anxiety of not knowing what tomorrow will bring, natural disasters and human-made events, divisions in families and communities, ... where is God's peace we may ask? Perhaps it is among you, around you, and within you, but you don't recognize it for you are overwhelmed by the news and snarky remarks of people who feel they need to express their sense of pride. I advise you to get away from it all. Go for a walk, enjoy the beauty and the earthly smell of a mum, take a drive and see the beauty of the fall leaves, notice the earth in all its beauty and wrap yourself into the evolving rhythms of the year: Fall, Winter, Spring, Summer. While Fall brings with it the hush of darkness by five p.m., that darkness will soon be replaced by the splendor of colored lights to point us again to our Savior, Jesus Christ, the light of the world. Take the time to enjoy those lights. If you have a string of Christmas lights at home, I encourage you to place them on a tree outside or inside your house now to remind yourself that the Lord is good, merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love. His light will penetrate any darkness that surrounds our life.

I was recently to a retreat for rostered leaders at Camp Mt. Luther where Psalm 62 was read from Robert Alter's version of The Book of Psalms.

2 Only in God is my being quiet. From Him is my rescue.

3 Only He is my rock and my rescue. I shall not stumble at all.

4 How long will you demolish a man—commit murder, each one of you—

5 Only from his high place they schemed to shake him.

They took pleasure in lies. With their mouths they blessed and inwardly cursed.

6 Only in God be quiet, my being, for from Him is my hope.

7 Only He is my rock and my rescue, my fortress—I shall not stumble.

8 From God is my rescue and glory, my strength's rock and my shelter in God.

9 Trust in Him at all times, O people.

Pour out your hearts before Him. God is our shelter.

10 Only breath—humankind, the sons of man are a lie.

On the scales all together they weigh less than a breath.

11 Do not trust in oppression and of theft have no illusions.

Though it bear fruit of wealth, set not your heart upon it.

12 One thing God has spoken, two things have I heard:

that strength is but God's, and Yours, Master, is kindness. For you requite a man by his deeds.

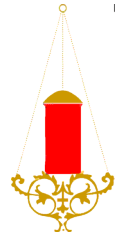

Time of Worship

Council decided to continue having one worship service at 9:00 a.m. this Fall. Our attendance has remained down and it cannot be justified to going back to two worship services at this point in time. Some people have expressed a desire to change the worship time. While a poll resulted in a variance of opinions council decided to return to this topic at its October council meeting.

Why Wear a Mask in Worship?

The Center for Disease Control recommends washing your hands, wearing a mask, and physical distancing to protect you from catching the coronavirus and protect you from spreading the virus to others. The coronavirus is much different than the flu because one can be asymptomatic (have no fever or other symptoms) and yet be a carrier and infect other people. Young people are more likely to be carriers and seniors and those with diabetes and other medical conditions are more likely to suffer from shortness of breath and kidney issues if they are infected by the virus. The coronavirus is an airborne disease in which it is transmitted by aerosolized droplets and breathed in by the nasal passages infecting people. Unlike the flu, a person can be re-infected with the coronavirus more than once. It also can cause permanent lung scarring, heart damage, and kidney damage. People who are at high risk, including some within our congregation, can be more susceptible of contracting the virus. As a result, some of our members at high risk have stayed away from worship. We have to be sensitive to their spiritual needs and support them as the community of faith. That is why it is so important to wash our hands, wear a mask, and physically distance ourselves during the 50 minutes of worship so we protect others and protect ourselves. It also means separating ourselves from others by sitting in every other pew. While this pandemic has lasted for seven months and maybe longer, time is on our side. The longer we take precautions the more the virus will diminish in its strength. I pray for those who are ill with the virus and pray for the time when we will no longer need to wear masks. May it come soon. I can only urge you to wash your hands, wear a mask, and physically distance yourself. As a cancer survivor I will continue to wear my mask to protect you and protect myself. Please sit in a pew with another pew between you and the next family. We have plenty of room to spread out at St. John and we will continue to offer worship each Sunday on Facebook.

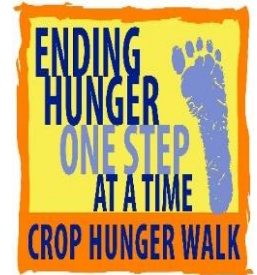
Blanket Sunday

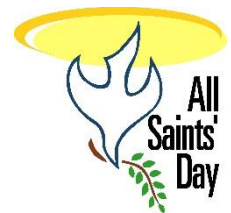
- One sweatshirt – hooded or unhooded (size L-XL)

This additional money has been added on to the Rising Anew loan. So, any donations to the Rising Anew loan will pay off the renovation and the new roof.

The Mission of the Church Goes on and Needs Your Support

For 2020 members of St. John have donated \$7,287.27 to the Upper Susquehanna Synod out of our annual commitment of \$18,500. That is a year-to-date deficit of \$5,176.76. We encourage you to donate to **Mission Support** as you are able. We have also given \$50 to Domestic Disaster Response, \$305 to Campus Ministry, \$30 to Blanket Ministry of the Women of the Church. **Mission Support** is a separate item that is not part of our annual budget and goes to the Upper Susquehanna Synod and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America to support its various ministries. While Camp Mt. Luther had to cancel its summer camp due to covid19 risks, their expenses to maintain the camp go on. Camp Mt. Luther appealed to the congregations of the Upper Susquehanna Synod for financial support. The Ministry of Christian Education at St. John Lutheran decided to donate \$1500 they received from the St. John Lutheran Endowment Fund, that is normally used for campers, to Camp Mt. Luther.

Simply send a text message to 570-865-1101 with the amount you would like to contribute (example: 25). Within a few minutes, you'll be sent a text with a link to register. Click on the link and enter your cardholder name and credit or debit card information. Once your registration is complete, you will receive a text verification and a receipt of your donation via email.

For future giving, send a text with the amount you wish to give, and it will process automatically! You can even text "repeat" to make it a recurring donation. Give+ Text is one of the fastest, easiest ways to give. We hope you enjoy this new way to share your generosity and we thank you for supporting your church.

Weis Certificates

As a special fundraiser for church projects we are selling Weis Markets gift certificates each Sunday after worship or during office hours during the weekdays. You can buy \$10, 20, 50, 100 certificates. You pay \$10, take them to the store and use them like cash to buy \$10 worth of groceries. The church earns 5% from Weis Markets. While that may not seem like much, if 100 families in the congregation spend \$100 per week on groceries that 5% would add up to \$26,000 per year with very little effort other than buying and reselling them. It is a great way to support the youth ministries of St. John. They are also available Tuesday-Thursday from Molly in the office.
